- San Lorenzo Market (Mercato Centrale)

The CAPA Florence Center occupies the first floor of the XVI Century Palazzo Galli Tassi; it is embellished by numerous frescoes (most of which are still visible) and has recently gone through a major operation of restoration and involved the work of professional art conservators. During the work, important pieces of art were discovered and brought back to their original sixteenth-century splendor!



You will enter the building through No. 20 and walk into a courtyard home to a beautiful marble sculpture representing Hercules and Iole.



As you continue up the stairs to the first floor, you will enter the Florence Center where all our eight [classrooms](#) are located, as well as our Global classroom, faculty room, some quiet study spaces, and two restrooms.

Though this is not a typical University campus experience, you will find all that you need to have a successful study abroad experience within the Center. Your dedicated student-facing staff all reside in this building.
